



Dear Pampered Pet ,

Let's chat about a little detail that can make a big difference in pet therapy visits – treats! While treats are wonderful for rewarding our pets, they might not be the best choice during therapy sessions. Imagine this: your furry friend is there to spread joy and comfort, but if treats are involved, they might start focusing more on snacks than on snuggling and sharing those warm, fuzzy moments.



Plus, treats can introduce surprises, like allergies or unexpected behavior changes. We want our therapy visits to be as smooth and delightful as possible, so keeping the focus on genuine interaction ensures that both pets and the people they visit can fully enjoy the experience. So, let's keep those treats in the training jar and focus on the heartfelt connections that make therapy visits so special!

Chapter Spotlight: North San Diego County

Oceanside, CA – Established in 2001, our North San Diego County Chapter is our oldest chapter and one of Love on a Leash's most dynamic. At the time, it was home to all San Diego County teams. It was not until 2006, after the chapter roster became very large, that San Diego Inland peeled off to form a new chapter focusing on East San Diego County and 2010 when San Diego Central spread its wings to form a new chapter focusing on South San Diego County. With a storied past and a vibrant present, this chapter continues to lead the way in pet therapy. We recently reached out to some of their dedicated leaders and members, and are thrilled to share their insights and stories with you.



Susie and Beth : Leading with Passion – As the chapter's current co-leaders, Susie and Beth play pivotal roles in guiding the North San Diego County Chapter. Their dedication and leadership are key to the chapter's ongoing success and growth. **Susie Blake** has brought a wealth of experience and energy to her role. As a 19-year Love on a Leash® veteran, Susie explains how the chapter accommodates a range of visit types, from one-on-one interactions to larger group events. They handle all types of visits based on the needs of the facility or event. Their use of Meetup for scheduling makes it easy for their 236 members to sign up and stay organized. Meetup is a fantastic tool for managing their diverse range of activities.

Susie also highlights the variety of events the chapter engages in, including health fairs and even attending funerals when requested. Participating in such diverse events shows how trusted and valued their therapy teams are in the community. Social gatherings are another opportunity for teams to get to know each other outside official visits. The chapter has enjoyed group walks at Oceanside Harbor and Batiquitos Lagoon. These outings are a great way for members to connect and enjoy each other's company.



Beth Hulsart provides a valuable perspective on the chapter's history and current activities. North San Diego County is the birthplace of what is now a national organization. It is incredible to see how they have grown over 23 years from a small passionate group of individuals into a large, active chapter with over 200 teams.

Beth meets with almost every new team in training and emphasizes the chapter's involvement in a variety of settings, including retirement communities, schools and special events like Legoland trips. Visits are tailored to fit the needs of each facility. Whether it's a large event at a college or a more intimate setting, they adapt their approach to make the most impact.

Janet and Mary : Honoring Past Leadership – Janet Downer and Mary Gleisberg, former leaders of the chapter, have both made significant contributions to the chapter's growth and success. Mary's decade of leadership (2011-2021) helped shape the chapter's expansion and impact all over North County. Although Janet only led the chapter for a brief 7 months, her 10 years of service have been a personal journey, "My reason for getting into doing it was for children with learning differences. So, you're going to see me gravitate to more schools to help kids' reading. I have a grandson who has dyslexia, so he's the reason I do therapy work. He had a therapy dog that would come to his school and it's the only thing that gave him confidence to learn to read."

Mary's contributions as chapter leader built on her predecessor, Gina Austin's previous decade of founding groundwork, ensuring the chapter's growth & success. Over 23 years, the members who committed to lead this historic chapter have been instrumental in preserving this strong foundation and ensuring it continues to thrive.



The North San Diego County Chapter also has some amazing long-term members who have taken on leadership roles and helped to grow the community that they are able to serve. One of these dedicated members is **Beverly Hodges** (pictured above), who has been a member since 2002, certifying first with her standard poodle, Molly, and later with her miniature poodle, Kiwi. When she lost Kiwi a few years ago, around the time she turned 90 years old, she concluded that it was not prudent to adopt another dog. Instead, Bev continues her weekly voluntary visits at Pacifica Vista and Laguna Estates with a plushie she named Kiwi.

She is not only an inspiration to new teams, but also to the seniors she visits and engages with a game of "Kiwi toss" to promote hand-eye coordination and puzzle time to encourage conversation. Bev is vibrant, always has a sparkle in her eye, and brings joy to every visit.






